2 Registration Information

Three ways to register

1. Mail-In Registration

- *Fill out the registration form. (Feel free to copy)
- *Identify class ID CODE as it is noted in the guide.
- *Mail-in registration begins December 11 for residents, non-residents may start mailing in forms December 18. Forms received after these dates will be processed on a first-come, first-served basis. Forms received prior to December 11 will be returned.
- *You must pay via cash or check when registering by mail.
- *Confirmation receipts will be mailed or emailed to confirm registration.
- *If a program is full, our office will notify you by phone and return your registration.

2. In-Person Registration

- *You are welcome to register in-person at our office located at City Hall, W240 N3065 Pewaukee Rd.
- *In-person registration will start December 11 at 8:00 a.m for residents, non-residents may start registering December 18.
- *Acceptable forms of payment in-person are cash, check, VISA, MasterCard or Discover.

3. Online Registration

- *You may register online starting December 11 at 8:00 a.m for residents, non-residents may register online starting December 18.
- *You must pay via credit card (VISA, MasterCard or Discover) when registering online.

RENEWAL REGISTRATION CLOSES ON MARCH 9th at 4:00pm.

After this date, previous SPARK participants will no longer be guaranteed their spot in the program and must go into the lottery (below).

NEW REGISTRATIONS for the SPARK program are handled

through a lottery system. Please request a SPARK registration packet after Feb. 1st by calling: 262-691-7275 or emailing kaskey@pewaukee.wi.us. Completed forms should be returned by March 9th to be entered into the lottery. The lottery will be held on March 12th.

Chosen registrants will be notified by email and must come in to the office for payment by March 19th.

Absolutely **NO EXCEPTIONS** will be made. Any registrant that fails to make payment by March 19th will be removed from the program and the waitlist will be contacted to take the spot. The forms will be chosen by **FAMILY**; meaning if you have multiple children either all of them will get into the program or none. Children must reside at the same address to be considered a family.

NOTE: Summer school dates had not been released at the time of printing.

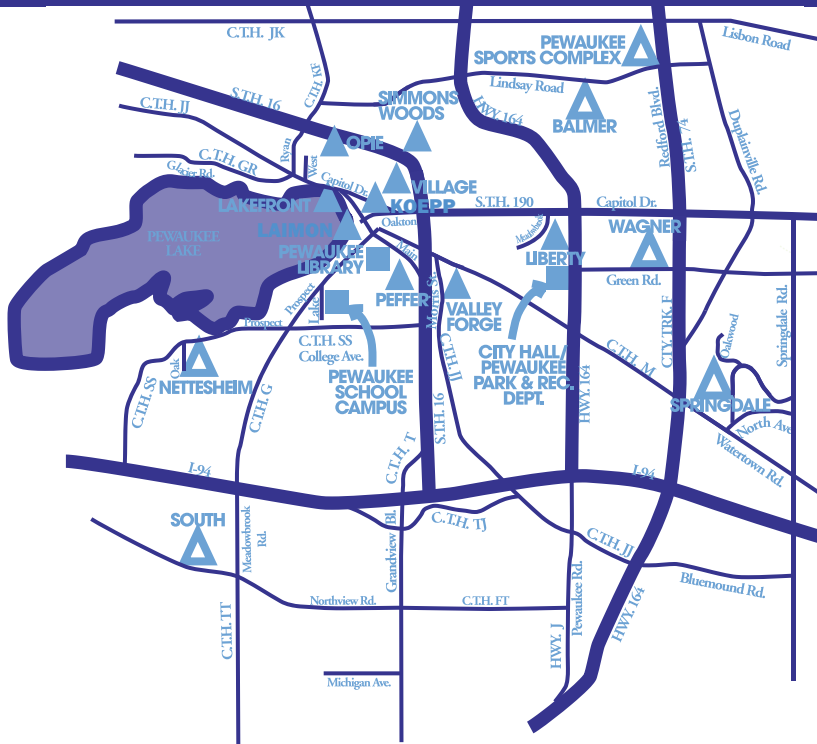
