

Registration Information

Returning Campers:

Registration for returning campers for all programs will be accepted February 2-20. During this time, 2025 participants will be guaranteed registration for 2026 with proper forms, documents, and payment/ payment plan.

Registration deposit payments must be completed by February 27 at 4:00pm. If you are a returning camp family and have another child that will be joining camp for the first time in 2026, they are automatically eligible to register as a returning camper.

Parents will receive an email in January explaining the steps needed to confirm registration.

Transfer Requests*: If you are a returning camper and would like to request your child be transferred to a different camp location, you may do so at time of registration.

(*) *Transfer requests will be considered after the renewal process ends and are not guaranteed.*

New Campers:

Due to increasingly high demand in our summer day camps, we utilize a lottery process for new families that were not in our camp programs in 2025.





DEPARTMENT POLICIES

Am I a Resident?

Any person who resides in or pays taxes to the City or Village of Pewaukee is a resident and pays the resident rate. Any business that is in/pays taxes to the City of Village of Pewaukee pays resident rates. All other individuals or businesses and considered non-residents.

Non-Discrimination Policy

It is the policy of the Pewaukee Parks & Recreation Department that no person shall, on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age, sexual orientation, or ability level be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity, including employment.

Inclusion Policy

Pewaukee Parks and Recreation encourages individuals with disabilities to participate in recreational programming. The term "inclusion" means that individuals are included in our programs in the same way people without disabilities participate. Our Department is pleased to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) regulations. Please contact the Parks and Recreation office for more information.

Registration Accounts

All people must have their own account. You cannot register people that are not in your household. Please do not make multiple accounts.

Registration Exceptions

Programs are designed according to age and/or instructor-student ratios or level that will best benefit the student. Please DO NOT ask us to exceed class limits or put your child in the wrong age or skill level.

Late Registration Fee

A late registration fee of \$10 will be added to any registration within 24 hours of the class start date or after the class has started. We do not prorate pricing for missed classes.

Waiting Lists

The Department will make every effort to accommodate those on the waiting lists if possible. If openings become available, you will be contacted.

Hospital/Medical Coverage

The Department does not provide hospital/medical insurance coverage for people participating in programs. Participants are encouraged to obtain their own insurance coverage prior to and for the duration of the activity they take part in.

No Smoking/Alcohol Use

The use of cigarettes (including vapes), alcohol, and illegal substances is prohibited in all recreation programs.

Refund Policy

Participants who request a refund not less than one week prior to the first day of the program will receive a full refund, less a \$10 administrative fee*. Requests within one week of the program start or after program start will not receive a refund except in the case of a medical reason documented by a physician.

*Some programs may not be eligible for a refund and will be indicated as such.

Program Cancellations

In the event that a program is cancelled due to low enrollment, instructor conflict, or other reason, participants will be notified by email at least 48 hours prior to the scheduled start of the program.

Department Sales Tax

Sales tax is included in all the activities in the program fee in accordance with the Department of Revenue laws.

Weather Class Cancellations Due to Weather

For information on cancelled classes/programs due to inclement weather, participants will be contacted via email or text. The department will make every effort to make up cancelled program dates. In the case that a make-up date is not possible, participants may be eligible for a credit to use toward a future program.

Photo Release

For promotional purposes - only authorized Pewaukee Parks and Recreation staff members may take photos of participants in our activities/events. If you do not wish to have your photo taken, please notify the photographer and our office.
